Story telling: Creating a story

TARGET GROUP	Migrants learning foreign language
LEARNING OBJECTIVES	 Learners will absorb and improve 12 new sentences related to their hobbies and interests while writing a story. Learners will discover 30 new words related to their hobbies and interests
INGREDIENTS	Board or book to write story, board marker, pens
DESCRIPTION	PREPARATION: Before the class, teachers are invited to choose a topic related to social life, hobbies or entertainment. The topic can be also the one that was already discussed in previous lessons. NB: Some suggestion for the topics; 1. Playing football (see example below) 2. Hiking on the mountain 3. Organizing intercultural dinner 4. Going to see a movie together START THE GAME: Explain the activity to the learners and that they have to focus on the topic while creating the story. PLAY: • Choose three volunteers among the participants. Two volunteers have to tell the story following the sentence that the first learner starts. • Meanwhile, the third volunteer will write the story on a board or in a notebook. The writing task can also be done by the teacher. In this step it's important to highlight that they have to follow the story that the previous participant has started and continue to keep the sense of the story. For each story they will have 15 minutes to work in the group. • Divide class in groups of three learners each. Give a topic to each group: they will work within the group to create a story. For each turn they are allowed to say one sentence. After some time (about 5 minutes), learners should change their roles in order to practice with both speaking and writing skills. This stage can be tricky because they will work on creating a story; teachers should support learners to find correct words for the sentence if they are struggling. • Let's start!

Example:

Learner 1: I play football Learner 2: after the school Learner 1: with my classmate Learner 2: it is very fun Learner 1: we enjoy it a lot Learner 2: we want to... Learner 1: invite more friends Learner 2: who likes football

COMPLEMENTARY MATERIALS

Learner 2: You can invite them tomorrow

Learner 1: wow I am so excited Learner 2: See you tomorrow Learner 1: bye see you!

Learner 1: I have some friends

DEBRIEF:

At the end, each group will share the story with the whole class.

Mimic Game

TARGET GROUP	Migrants learning foreign language
LEARNING OBJECTIVES	 Learners will learn 20 verbs related to hobbies and interests Learners will learn how to work in a team
INGREDIENTS	Blank paper, pen, list of verbs
DESCRIPTION	PREPARATION: Prepare the pieces of papers or cards with the list of the hobbies and interests (see the example below). START THE GAME: Start the discussion in the class asking participants what their hobbies are. Give around 10 minutes giving opportunity for each learner to share their hobbies. This will also help you to bring their attention to the topic. PLAY: Divide the class into two teams and decide the team who is starting. Choose one participant from each team who will come to the front of the class and sit with their back to the board. They are not allowed to look at the board. Write on the board three words with conjugated verbs related to the hobbies and interests. When you say PLAY, two teams start miming the first word to their player who is at the front of the class. The first player who correctly guesses the word, gets the point. Then, they will continue with the second word, and so on When all three words have been guessed correctly, you can change the role, invite new players from each team to the front of the class and write down three new words on the board. The game continues until everyone has had a turn guessing mimes.

Categories Game

TARGET GROUP	Migrants learning foreign language
LEARNING OBJECTIVES	 Learners will improve 30 new vocabularies related to festivals Learners will learn name of 4 festivals
INGREDIENTS	Paper, pen, categories sheets
DESCRIPTION	PREPARATION: NB: This game is suggested to play in pairs or in groups of 3 to 4 learners. Print the categories sheets from the complementary materials (cfr. Annex). Alternatively, you can invite learners to draw several columns. START THE GAME: On top of each column, ask them to write the name of the festivals. For example: Christmas, Easter, Halloween, Carnival etc. PLAY: For each festival, the teacher reads 10 words related to the festival (provided in the example), and gives one minute to memorise them. They cannot make a note at this time! Ask students to write words related to the festival presented before in the corresponding column. For example: in the Christmas column they will gather all the words related to that festival, such as, lights, presents, Santa Claus, snow, cookies, party, holiday etc They will have two minutes to write the words. Once the time is finished, the teacher asks each group to read the list they wrote. The group with the most words wins. In the same way, they will continue writing words for other festivals. Each word they find gives them one point. The team with the biggest score wins. They can play for all the categories in the same team, or to make it more dynamic, you can change the team for each category.

TARGET GROUP	Migrants learning foreign language
LEARNING OBJECTIVES	 Learners will be able to read 10 questions about host related to country Learners will learn 10 new things (history, culture etc) about host country
INGREDIENTS	Online quizzes, internet, phone/tablet/computer
DESCRIPTION	This game will be interesting to play in the class: learners will play individually all at the same time. PREPARATION: • The questions are already prepared and available to play on the Quizizz platform. • Before starting this activity, teachers are invited to make sure that all students are in possession of a phone, tablet or a computer. It's also necessary to have an internet connection. START THE GAME: Once the preparation is done, the teacher will ask students to open the following link, which contains quizzes related to the host country. Questions with the quizzes related to Italy: https://quizizz.com/admin/quiz/6438ff03b06a23001e52bab0/game-on-project-learning-about-host-country?searchLocale= PLAY: • Following the instructions from the platform, teachers will start the quizzes one by one, where students will have 30 seconds to choose the correct answer for each question. • Once all the answers have been collected, the teacher will be able to see the results.
	 For each correct answer they will get 2 points, and the student with the most points wins.

TARGET GROUP	Migrants learning foreign language
LEARNING OBJECTIVES	Learners will be able to write answers to twelve questions about a person describing their foreign studying experience.
INGREDIENTS	 Computer/tablet/smartphone and internet connection Quizizz app/website, link with the questions.
DESCRIPTION	 PREPARATION: Share the Quizizz link, QR code or the game reference number with the learners. Choose to play individually and click "Play". START THE GAME: The participants have cards with a short text to read on one side. PLAY: The learner reads the text, then answers the reading comprehension question. The learner submits the answer to see if he/she correctly understood the reading exercise.
COMPLEMENTARY MATERIALS	It may also be a nice challenge to have learners then tell the story of Annalisa's foreign study experience, either by writing it or talking about it.
